SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General information:

Take affected persons out into the fresh air.

Seek immediate medical advice.

After inhalation: Seek medical treatment in case of complaints.

After skin contact: Immediately wash with water and soap and rinse thoroughly.

After eve contact:

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids.

Check for and remove any contact lenses. Continue to rinse for at least 10 minutes.

Get medical attention if irritation occurs.

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After swallowing:

Drink plenty of water and provide fresh air. Call for a doctor immediately.

Seek immediate medical advice.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Inhalation of vapors may cause the lower and upper respiratory irritation, cough and breathing difficulty. At higher concentrations can cause pulmonary edema.

Ingestion may cause health disorders, including stomach pain and sting, nausea and vomiting. The contact of the product with skin causes sensitization (dermatitis). Dermatitis derives from skin inflammation that begins in the skin areas that come in contact with the sensitizing agent. Skin lesions may include erythema, edema, papules, pustules, rashes, flakes, cracks and sweating phenomena vary with the phases of the disease and affected areas. In the acute phase prevail edema, erythema and sweating, chonic phases prevail flakes, dryness, cracking and thickening skin.

Respiratory protection:

Regulation EN 14387). In case there are gases or vapors from different nature and / or gases with particles (aerosols, fumes, mists, etc.) should be used combined type filters.

The use of protective equipment Respiratory protection is necessary if the adopted technical measures taken are not sufficient to limit worker exposure to referential threshold values. The protection provided by masks is limited. In case where the substance in question is odorless or its olfactory threshold is higher than the TLV-TWA and relevant emergency, wear a compressed air breathing apparatus (ref. Standard EN 137) or breathing external ventilation device (ref. Regulation EN 138). For a correct choice of the system of protection from the airways, see Regulation EN 529.

Material of gloves

The selection of the suitable gloves does not only depend on the material, but also on further marks of quality and varies from manufacturer to manufacturer. As the product is a mixture of several substances, the resistance of the glove material can not be calculated in advance and has therefore to be checked prior to the application.

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Penetration time of glove material
